Project Background Although East and Southeast Asian regions have very rich biodiversity when viewed on a global basis, information on such biodiversity is scattered and has not been fully developed in a available form. For this reason, there is a need to enhance provision of biodiversity information needed for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity in this region, through support for a broad-ranging development of biodiversity information.

Objectives

Through promoting development and provision of biodiversity information and enhancement of taxonomic capacity building needed for policy/decision making under the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and conservation measures in each country, this project aims to contribute to implementation of the Strategic Plan for achieving the CBD Post 2010 Target, with the participation of the countries of East and Southeast Asia and related organizations.

 - Development of manuals for identification, etc.
