Rules of Implementation, Rules of Procedures for the Joint Committee and Project Cycle Procedure was also explained.</p> <p>2) Overview of the MOEJ's Study Programme and Financing Programme</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study Programme and Financing Programme <p>GEC introduced overview of study programme for JCM project including basic concept, scheme, roadmap of the JCM. Objectives are to develop JCM Methodology and to make JCM Project Design Document. The key points of JCM methodology are setting eligibility criteria and the reference emissions. 3) Capacity Building Programmes for the JCM

IGES Capacity Building Activities are dissemination and reform of the CDM since 2003 and these of JCM since 2011. Target countries are Mongolia, China, India, Lao PDR, Thailand, Viet Nam, Cambodia, Philippines, Indonesia and so on. IGES supports for the introduction of the JCM through workshops and matching.

OECC operates New Mechanism Information Platform. Information are provided through Platform such as Japan's initiative, Support Programmes and NAMAs submission by countries etc. by both English and Japanese languages.
