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Human Resources Development In the Asia-Pacific Region

- UNU would like to propose three actions, following the recommendations of the APFED final report on "Capacity Drive for Sustainable Development, which was prepared by UNU:
- Cross-border postgraduate SD courses through a network of credible universities;
- Strengthening of SD courses in business schools in Asia and the Pacific; and
- On the Job Training on SD especially by transnational corporations.



Asia Pacific Initiative

- Asia Pacific Initiative launched at the WSSD in 2002.


- Promotes field and project based to online learning through the *FeeltheEarth* Portal and *ibrowser*. The initial partners included LEAD Japan, Keio University, CISCO Systems (Japan) and the UNU.

- Commenced multi-institutional collaboration with support from FASID to organize **video conference based seminar series** on environmental topics in Asia Pacific from September 2005 to February 2006.

- 7 partner universities, 40 lecturers and 70 students. Weekly 3 hour video conference seminars linking all sites. Online learning support using the **Moodle learning management system** (free open source software).

- Four universities gave credits to their students. Seminar series was seamlessly integrated into existing teaching programmes.

- Two new courses to begin in September 2006 on Disaster Management and on the Environment.





Cross-border Postgraduate SD Courses

- Existing initiatives:
 - Asia Pacific Initiatives for inter-university collaboration on SD courses
 - University Consortium for UNEP-Tongji Project on SD Master Course
- UNU could take a lead by making MOUs with credible universities in the Asia-Pacific region.
- Universities could share courses (credits) for postgraduate SD diploma, making the best use of their strong areas.
- Exchange of professors would also be promoted.
- The initial courses could start in 2007-2008. The number of participating universities would be expanded in 2010.



Strengthening of SD Courses in Business Schools

- To train SD-conscious business leaders by strengthening SD courses in business schools in Asia and the Pacific;
- New courses could start from 2007-2008. The number of participating business schools would be expanded in 2010.
- Such activities would also be undertaken for different disciplines of undergraduate courses in the future.



On the Job Training (OJT) on SD

- Promotion of OJT to strengthen the capacity of the Asia-Pacific region
- Improvement of SD components could make OJT more attractive, especially in transnational corporations.
- Major topics may include energy efficiency improvement, renewable energy, 3R, agro-diversity etc.
- Manuals may be developed jointly with Japanese transnationals, on the basis of the Keidanren's Global Environment Charter.
