10th Inter-Governmental Meeting (IGM) and Scientific Planning Group Meeting (SPG), Kobe, Japan. 13-15 April 2005

The APN's 10th IGM/SPG convened in Kobe, Japan, and was hosted by the Ministry of the Environment, Japan. Special thanks to the IGM Chair, Mr. Kazuhiko Takemoto (APN national Focal Point for Japan), the Vice-Chair, Mr. Sovannora Ieng (APN national Focal Point for Cambodia), and the SPG-Chairs, Drs. Amir Muhammed (Pakistan) and Andrew Matthews (New Zealand) for their outstanding efforts at guiding the 10th IGM/SPG to success. It was also fantastic to see the

active participation of our global change partners IGBP, IHDP and START at the APN's 10th anniversary celebrations in Kobe.

Mr. Seizo Matsumoto, Vice Minister for Global Environmental Affairs, Ministry of the Environment, Japan, gave an opening speech. In his speech, Mr. Matsumoto highlighted the following points:

- The establishment and subsequent success of the CAPaBLE Programme;
- Appreciation to Australia, New Zealand, and the USA for their dedication to the Programme and to developing countries for their extensive and active contributions;
- The 3rd Earth Observation Summit (EOS) was held in Brussels in February 2005 and a ten-year implementation plan for the Global Earth Observation System of Systems (GEOSS) was adopted. The APN will positively contribute to earth observations;
- The APN is recognised as a significant international network; thanks to governments, members and the APN Secretariat;
- Significant contributions from Hyogo Prefectural Government for hosting the APN in addition to their monetary contributions for scientific activities; and
- Japanese Ministry of the Environment (MOEJ) will continue its strong participation in APN activities.

Mr. Sombo Yamamura, APN Secretariat Director, in his welcome address highlighted some of the APN's activities:

- 10 years is a major milestone and an appropriate time to review activities and to learn from the past and plan for the future;
- In the past 12 months, the Secretariat has worked closely with Mr.
 Randal Helten, consultant to the APN, to perform the evaluation and draft a Second Strategic Plan for the next phase of APN activities;
- All functions of the APN Secretariat were transferred to IGES in April 2004. Some innovative results were produced including the establishment of an independent account for the APN; and

• There is growing awareness of the APN at the global level and within global change activities.

The IGM approved twenty-four (24) projects for funding in 2005/2006 from an activities budget of approximately 790,000 US dollars—five (5) continuing multi-year projects, nineteen (19) new projects and four (4) projects to receive a seed grant.

The IGM also approved four (4) new capacity building projects under the APN CAPaBLE Programme amounting to 105,000 US dollars.

The aforementioned projects selected cover a variety of important global change issues and activities throughout the Asia-Pacific region. The full list is included on pp9-15 of this newsletter.

The Secretariat was very pleased with the many positive outcomes of the IGM/SPG, particularly the acceptance of the APN Evaluation Report and the adoption of the Second Strategic Plan. The IGM/SPG also gave a clear indication of what we must aim to achieve over the next year.

As agreed at the meeting we will be actively working to:

- Ensure effective interaction with the new Steering Committee;
- Implement the Second Strategic Plan:
- Prepare an operating plan;
- Prepare the revisions for the Framework Document;
- Support the Resources Development Committee to secure future resources; and
- Implement the agreed budget plan with a specific focus on science activities.
