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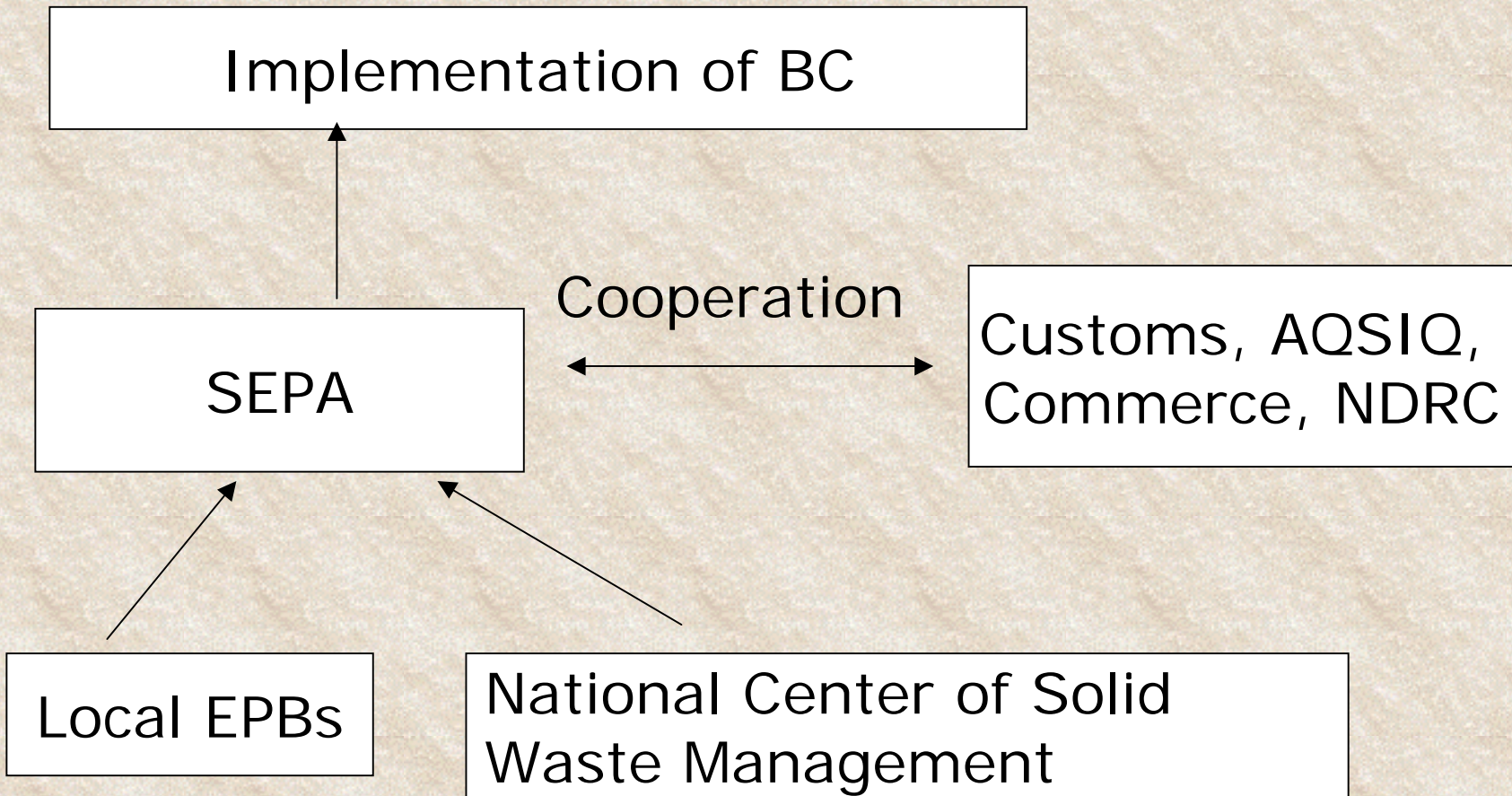

Good Practices of Coordination

with AQSIQ, GACC, NDRC, MOC

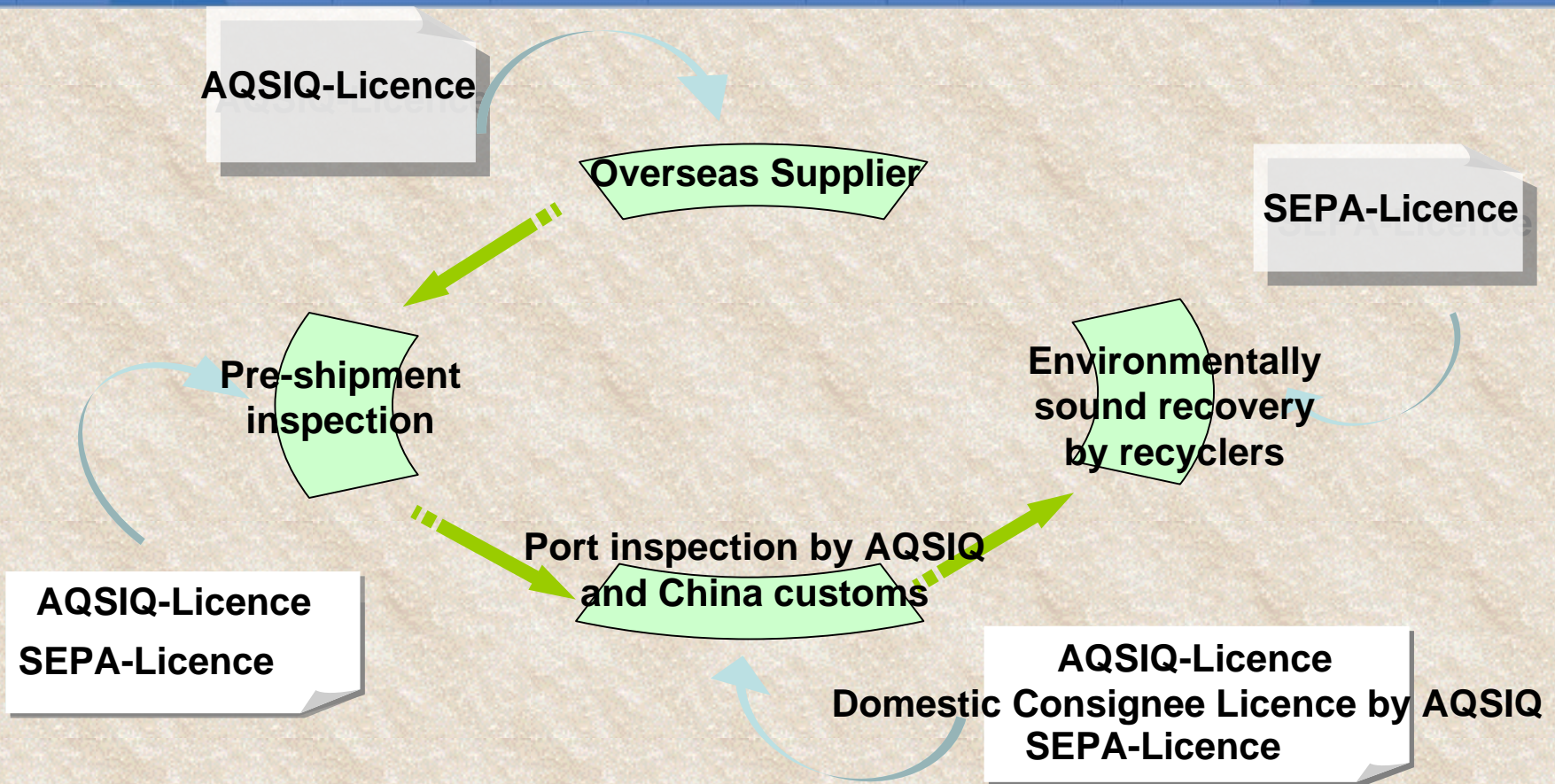
- Interagency Coordination meeting
- Dual use of electronic and paper certificates at ports since Oct. 2005
- Exchange of information about domestic importers with AQSIQ
- Cooperate with the Customs to crack down on illegal traffic: Sky-hole patching

Import

Licensing

- Solid wastes that can be used as raw materials are only allowed to be imported with a special import license
- Supervision and monitoring are done to ensure that imported waste are recycled in an environmentally sound manner

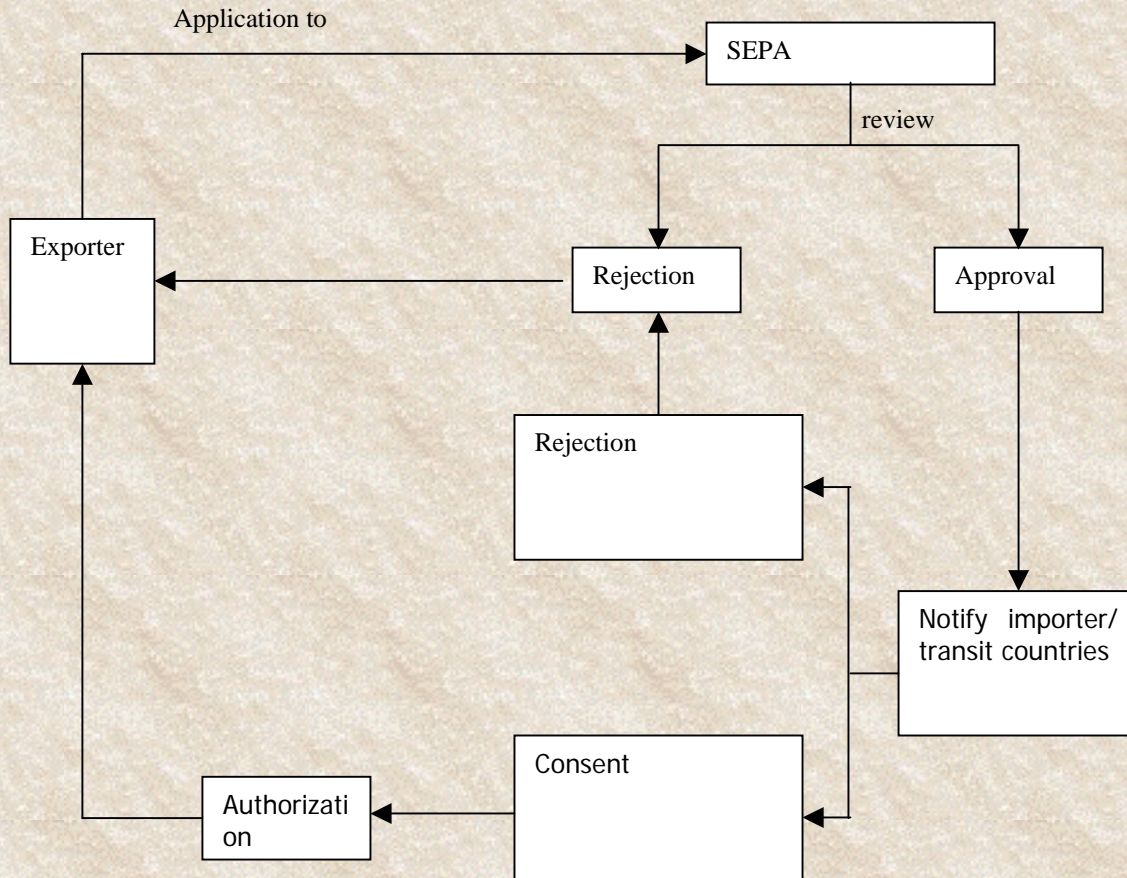


Export

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- Export only allowed when
 - there are no adequate recovery/disposal facilities in China that are capable of environmentally sound disposal of the waste
 - must comply with the requirements of the Basel Convention:

- ***Regulations for the Environmental Management and Prevention and Control of Pollution by E-waste***
 - Issued in Sept. 2007 and will enter into effect on February 1st, 2008
- ***Guidelines for Formulating Emergency Response Measures by Hazardous Waste Management Entities***
- ***The Technical Specification for Identifying Hazardous Wastes***
- ***The Technical Specification for Pollution Control during Collection and Recycle of Waste Plastics***
- ***The Environmental Protection Technical Specification for Disassembly of End-of-life Vehicle***

- Measures on the Export Certificates of Hazardous Waste
- List of Restricted Imported Solid Wastes that Can Be Used as Raw Materials
- List of Automatic-Licensing Solid Wastes that Can Be Used as Raw Materials
- List of Wastes Prohibited against Import (being revised)
- National Catalogue of Hazardous Wastes
- Procedures for Identifying the Characteristics of Solid Wastes
- Measures on Waste Import Management (being drafted)
