

#### Implementation of Basel Convention

- Signed on 22 Mar. 1990.
- Ratified at the 21st Session of the Standing Committee of the 7th National People's Congress of P. R. China (NPC) on 4 Sep. 1991.
- Competent authority:

Ministry of Environmental Protection – MEP

(Named as State Environmental Protection Administration -SEPA before March 2008, and National Environmental Protection Agency - NEPA before 1998)



#### The newly introduced regulations

- Regulations on the Management of the Recovery and Treatment of Waste Electronic and Electrical Products (WEEE)
  - Decree No.551 of the State Council of the People's Republic of China
  - Promulgated on February 25, 2009 and shall come into force on January 1, 2011
  - Scope of application: the recovery and treatment as well as related activities of WEEE listed in the Catalogue of Waste Electronic and Electric Products for Treatment
  - The system of multiple channeled recovery and centralized treatment
  - The planning and permitting system of WEEE treatment facilities
  - The subsidy fund for the recovery and treatment of WEEE
  - The WEEE that are prohibited from import by the state cannot be imported



#### The newly introduced regulations

- Catalogues of Import Solid Wastes Management 2009
  - Announcement No.36, 2009 of MEP, MOFCOM, NDRC, GACC and AQSIQ, entered into effect on 1 August, 2009
  - Catalogue of Solid Wastes Forbidden to Import
  - The new revised Catalogue of Restricted Import Wastes contains 51 types of wastes, 17 types more than the old version
  - The new revised Catalogue of Automatic-Licensing Import Wastes contains 20 types of wastes, which has no difference from the old version.



#### The newly introduced regulations

- Rules on the Administration of Environmental Protection concerning Imported Waste Iron and Steel
  - In line with industrial policies on iron and steel manufacture
  - Implemented environmental impact assessment
  - Established environmental management systems such as management records and environmental monitoring
  - Keep technical and administrative employee for environmental protection
  - No illegal records especially providing false information, resale of imported waste, breaking environmental protection laws and regulations, etc.




#### The regulations under discussion

- Measures on the Administration of Waste Import
- Measures on the Qualification and Administration of Designated Recycling Facilities of Imported Waste Electrical Appliances, Cables, Wires and E-Motors
- Guideline on the Management Records and Reports of Imported Waste Recycling Facilities
- Rules on the administration of imported waste recycling parks
- Rules on the administration of environmental protection of imported waste vessels, compact disks, compressed PET bottles, etc.



#### **Import Statistics**

 Imported 49.49 million tons of non-hazardous recyclable wastes used as raw materials in 2009
13266 MEP-licenses





#### **Export Statistics**

- 12 Notifications, 7240 ton of transboundary movement of hazardous waste were issued and approved in 2009
  - 4590 ton of waste battery
  - 1110 ton of galvanized sludge
  - 1500 ton of WEEE
  - 40 ton of fluorescent tube containing mercury
- Destination: Germany, Canada, Singapore, Japan, Republic of Korea, France.




Other activities

- Exchange waste transboundary information with competent authorities by email
  - IMPEL-TFS, the Netherlands, Belgium, Ireland, UK, Germany, Denmark, Italy, Sweden, Serbia, New Zealand, Australia, Korea, Oman
  - 129 cases exchanged by email in 2009, 38 of which are stopped before export
