
Concept of E-handbook

- E-handbook consists of several chapters by type of good practices
- Good practice of each country will be summarized into 1-2 pages
- The information will be uploaded to websites and can be accessible and downloadable from all the member countries and others

Benefit of E-handbook

What benefits can member countries obtain from e-handbook?

- Countries can learn and duplicate successful cases of other countries in an efficient manner
- When starting new activities, advice or support can be obtained from well-experienced countries
- Mutual understanding about the Basel enforcement activities can be enhanced
- In total, implementation capacity of the Basel Convention can be strengthened in the region



Progress of Developing E-handbook

- For the first project year, the Asian Network secretariat drafted a E-handbook based on available information
- The following four good practices are selected as the initial step
 - Closed loop management system (registration of oversea suppliers, pre-shipment inspection, port inspection and permission of recycling facilities) (China)
 - Joint inspection with customs authorities (Hong Kong SAR)
 - Awareness raising of the relevant stakeholders (Japan)
 - National E-waste management plan (Thailand)

Contents of the draft E-handbook

Contact Information

⇒Who is appropriate personnel or department to contact when further information is needed?

Objective of Activities

⇒What are the goals of activities?

Background Information

⇒What were the identified challenges before the activities started, and what triggered project/program inception (any social or environmental problems)?

😌 Target Group

⇒Who are the major targeted stakeholders? Whose empowerment or capacity development is mainly intended?

Implementation Framework

⇒Who is involved in the activities and how to coordinate with relevant ministries/organizations?

Contents of the draft E-handbook (cont.)

Difficulties and Obstacles

⇒After project/program started, what were difficulties or obstacles identified (e.g., lack of information, lack of cooperation, resource scarcity, etc)? How to overcome those problems?

Major Achievements

⇒What were achieved by the activities? Any change of objective data (e.g. decrease in import data of hazardous wastes, etc)

Difficulties for developing E-handbook



- Information is mainly based on the information from the AN workshop materials or from the websites of environment authorities of the countries/regions, but not sufficient
 - Information provision by member countries/regions are critical
- To make more user-oriented E-handbook, ideas or voices from potential users are essential

The secretariat invites comments about:

- What other practices should be shared among countries through E-handbook?
- Any other worthwhile information which should be added to the contents of E-handbook?
- What improvement can be made on the structure of Ehandbook? <u>Any good idea to make it more user-friendly</u> <u>and understandable?</u> (e.g., use of motion photos or video, etc)
