Project 1 IMPEL-TFS conference 2012

Will take place April/May 2012 in UK

Project 2 National Contact Points Exchange Days

Meet twice a year. Aims:

- share experiences on the enforcement of the WSR
- to get a better view on the waste shipment industry
- to get a better view on the export of waste outside the EU
- to generating input for the IMPEL-TFS Steering Committee
- to discuss enforcement case studies
- consequences of the Regulation on end-of-waste criteria.



Project 3 Enforcement Actions III

Aims:

- To work towards an adequate level of inspections in all Member States and a consistent level of enforcement at all exit points of the EU;
- Promote site inspections at points of loading and encourage a cradle-to-grave approach to inspection to minimise illegal shipments;
- To verify waste destination and the treatment at their destination within or outside Europe;
- To facilitate take-back procedures after an illegal shipment has taken place;
- To maintain and improve the network of front line inspectors, inspection methods, exchange of information and knowledge; and experiences.

Project 3 Enforcement Actions III

Activities:

- Coordinated exchanges of front line inspectors between participating countries during 2012 and 2013.
- Inspections during three months in 2012 and 2013.
- Undertaking an adequate level of inspections with other competent authorities (such as police and customs) on waste shipments (harbours, trains, companies and road traffic).
- Chain approach: competent authorities to check the recovery facility in order to check that a shipment accords with the principle of 'environmentally sound management'. Also verification within non-OECD countries which have interrelation with TFS-project Asian Collaboration








Project 4 Doing the right Things for TFS

Aim:

- To develop a practical guidance tool, based on the DTRT Guidance Book, which can help improve the organisation of ws inspection by competent authorities in the IMPEL member countries.
- To stimulate the use of the guidance tool by the competent authorities for ws inspections. The competent authorities take where necessary measures and make changes in their organisation.

Project 5 Waste Sites

Aim:

To identify good practices and develop a practical guidance tool for the inspection of "upstream" waste sites, and for the promotion of compliance with waste law on these sites.



Project 6 Prosecutors Project

Aim:

- Stimulate and strengthen the start of a platform or (informal) network of prosecutors in Europe involved in the prosecution of environmental crime with a special focus on the WSR.
- Exchange relevant case law, prosecution information like the level of fines, working methods, prosecution approach, interpretation and practical experiences.
- Explore the possibility to set up an interactive database of environmental case law.



Project 7 African Collaboration

Aim

- Maintain contacts in key African countries with Competent Authorities (focus on West Africa) and the enforcement network established under the SBC' E-waste Africa project;
- Exchange information concerning problematic waste streams and import restrictions;
- Agree on how to deal with verification requests and detected illegal shipments and their return;
- Nurture the establishment network and enforcement skills by exchanging inspectors from the EU to Africa.



Project 8 Asian Collaboration

Aim to partner with the Asian Network, local BCRC's, MEA-REN or other suitable co-sponsor to:

- Raise awareness of the problem and impacts of waste shipments arriving in Asian destinations
- Establish a simple but robust contact regime so as to better deal with illegal traffic —through National Contact Points
- Share experiences between the IMPEL TFS programme in Europe and the experience in Asia.



Project 8 Asian Collaboration

Aim to partner with the Asian Network, local BCRC's, MEA-REN or other suitable co-sponsor to:

- Clarify the national laws and requirements of respective importing and IMPEL-TFS cluster exporting States for waste imports and exports,
- Gather information about licensed facilities in Asia that work in an environmentally sound manner.
- Arrange exchange visits and participation in IMPEL TFS training/inspection projects




Suggestion for concrete project
