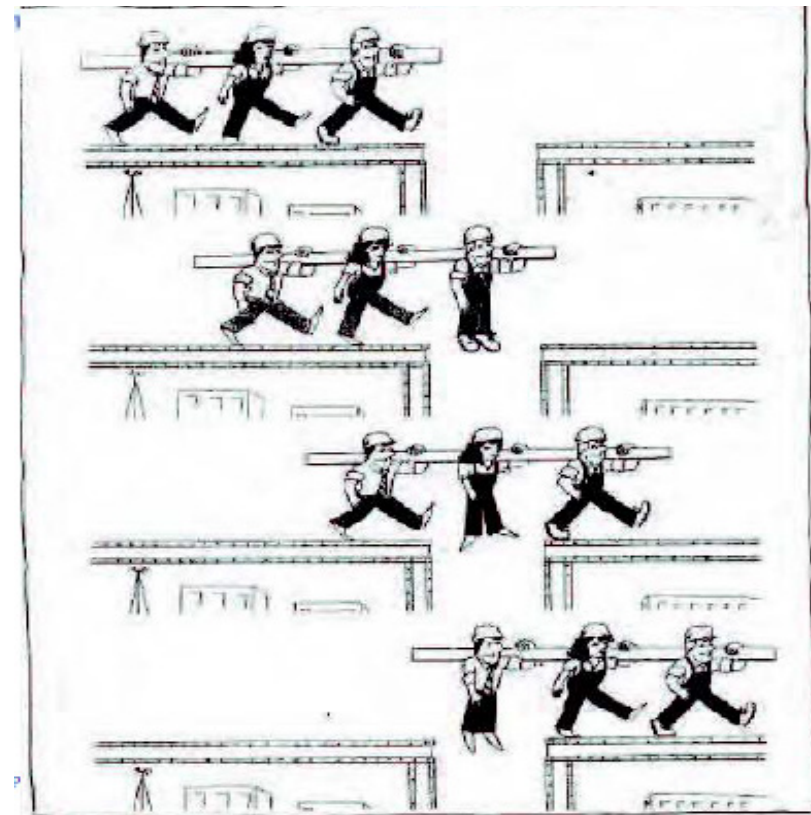

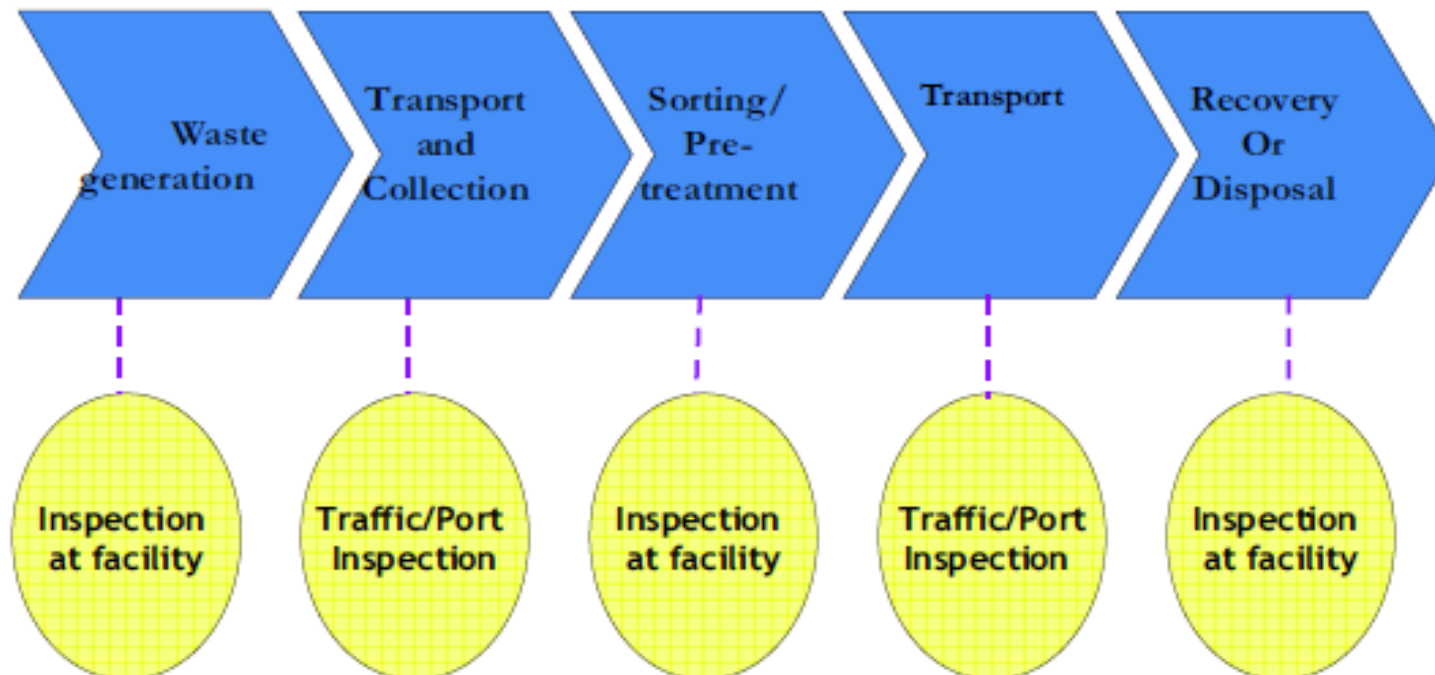
- Various authorities and legal powers

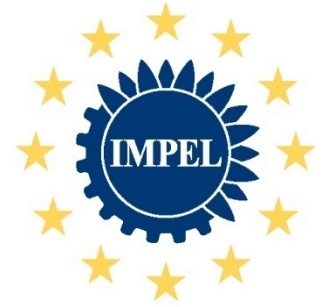

Multi-agency collaboration

Step 1

- Identify your key organisations;
- Identify the roles, competences and legal power of these organisations;
- Identify the information they have;
- Identify how you want to collaborate with them.

Multi-agency collaboration

Examples of different roles and competences:

- Who is responsible for the implementation of the Basel convention and has the knowledge;
- Who has the power to stop containers and vehicles;
- Who has the power to inspect a facility;
- Who is responsible for the repatriation!
