TOR of the Asian Network (developed in 2004) (1)

Nature of the Network	Participation is voluntary. Participating countries are required to review the TOR when necessary.
Purpose	 Sharing information and creating a common understanding on the status of illegal TBM Assisting the country's authorities to take national actions to control illegal TBM Contributing to the development of a common approach for preventing illegal TBM
Activities	 Collecting and disseminating information Providing a forum for facilitating day-to-day information exchange and dialogue among participating countries Supplying information for capacity building activities Organizing workshops, seminars, etc. Developing a website
Geographical coverage	 Initially 10 countries and one special administrative region participated in the network The Network welcomes participation of the Parties of the Basel Convention in North-east and South-east Asia.

TOR of the Asian Network (developed in 2004) (2)

Participating countries	 Each country shall designate a national contact point for the Network. Expected functions of the contact point include: Furnishing the network with relevant information Establishing collaboration with customs and port authorities Advising the Network Secretariat on the Network operation
BCRCs	Active and continued participation of BCRC-China and BCRC-SEA is crucially important for Network development.
Secretariat	 During the inaugural phase, Network development activities will be primarily conducted and coordinated by MOEJ . The government of Japan has the responsibility to report on the Network activities to the Secretariat of the Basel Convention. However, once the Network has been successfully established, functions of the current secretariat is expected to transfer to BCRC(s) in the region.
Finance	 During the inaugural phase, the Network activities will be primarily financed by MOEJ. The BCRC(s) in the region is(are) expected to manage the subsequent arrangements after the Network has been successfully established with funding from the Basel Secretariat, however this option must first be discussed amongst concerned parties.



Session 1: Updates on national Regulations, Implementation Status of the Basel Convention (day1) [Facilitators: BCRC-China and BCRC-SEA]

Objective: To share the latest information on policies, rules and regulations and TBM trend of hazardous wastes, particularly E-waste and UEEE

Session 2: Possible actions to address difficulties on the implementation of takeback procedures in Asia (day2) [Facilitator: Mr. Geri Sanz, DENR-EMB, Philippines]

Objective: To learn practices of the Asian countries, to strengthen border control and understand the difficulties of implementing the takeback procedure

Session 3: Outcomes of the 10th Meeting of the Open-ended Working Group of the Basel Convention (OEWG10) (day2) [Facilitator: The Secretariat of the Basel Convention]

Objective: To appreciate the discussions at OEWG10 and the ongoing inter-sessional work, and to discuss possible inputs from Asian countries
