Development of Regional Standard Requirements for Transboundary Movement (TBM) of Plastic Waste into the ASEAN Region and Pilot Study on Optimization of Domestic Plastic Waste Utilization

Background:

- plastic has become a significant source of environmental pollutants
- plastic waste still features economic value
- import plastic scraps from foreign sources to supply national demand
- imported plastic scraps contain hazardous waste illegal transboundary movement (TBM) of waste.
- BCRC-SEA recognises the need to collaborate and work with the relevant ASEAN's working groups to develop regional capabilities on the implementation of the Basel Convention, including the amendment regarding plastic waste.


Objectives:

- Ensure that all AMS and plastic industry in the region are aware of the implications of the amendment to the Basel Convention on plastic waste
- Promote the capacity of AMS in the effective control of TBM of plastic waste to prevent illegal TBM of plastic waste in the ASEAN region
- Promote the Optimization of domestically-generated plastic waste Utilization and minimization of TBM of plastic waste
- Promote partnerships to support circular economy in the ASEAN region for recycling of plastic waste in an environmentally sound manner

Activities:

- Pilot study on the plastic waste Utilization/absorption in recycling industry in a selected AMS (Indonesia).
- Review on legal and institutional frameworks and development of recommended regional standard requirements for TBM of plastic waste in ASEAN.
- Regional meeting for dissemination of the pilot study report, vade-mecum and consultative meeting with AMS and other key stakeholders on the recommended regional standard requirements for TBM of plastic waste
