Ordinance Specifying Wastes that Japan Needs to Control Based on the Council Decision Concerning the Control of Transboundary Movements of Wastes Destined for Recovery Operations of the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (Ministry of the Environment Ordinance No. 41, December 26, 2001)

The Ordinance Specifying Wastes that Japan Needs to Control Based on the Council Decision Concerning the Control of Transboundary Movements of Wastes Destined for Recovery Operations of the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Health and Welfare and Ministry of International Trade and Industry Joint Ordinance No. 2 of 1993) shall be revised in its entirety as follows:

Wastes specified in Article 2, paragraph (1) of the Order for Enforcement of the Law for the Control of Export, Import and Others of Specified Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes that Japan needs to control based on the Council Decision concerning the control of transboundary movements of wastes destined for recovery operations of the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (hereinafter referred to as the "the Council Decision") shall be those wastes to be exported or imported for the disposal operations listed in Annex IVB of the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and Their Disposal (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") that fall under any of the following items:

- (i) Wastes listed in Appended Table 1 or wastes including any of them
- (ii) Wastes that fall under neither the wastes set forth in the preceding item nor the wastes listed in Appended Table 2, that have any of the hazardous characteristics listed in Annex III of the Convention

Supplementary Provisions

This ordinance shall come into effect as of the date of promulgation.

Remarks:

- 1. In regard to the wastes listed in row 1, the terms "in bulk finished form" in B1020 and "the following fluorinated polymer wastes" in B3010 of Annex IX of the Convention shall be deemed to be replaced with "in bulk finished form (including metal scraps in non-dispersible form)" and "the following fluorinated polymer wastes, including wastes of fluoroethylene polymers and copolymers (PTFE)," respectively.
- 2. With regards to wastes listed in rows 2, 5, and 6, those in dispersible form shall be excluded.
- 3. The designations listed in the right column of rows 2 to 11 are those in Annex 3 of the Council Decision.
- 4. Wastes listed in this Table shall not include those that have the characteristics listed in Annex III of the Convention as a result of adherence of or mixture in any of those listed in Annex I of the Convention.
