Bhutan at Glance

Bhutan is a Landlocked country, located in the midst of Himalayan ranges; India in the south, China in the north. Area: 46000 sq.km Population: 600 thousand **Religion: Bhudhist Vegetation:** Moderate

Thimphu: Capital city

Thimphu is the capital city located towards western part.
headquarter for all ministries offices.
Population: 80,000
Total Municipal area: 26 sq.km.

Solid Waste Management

Prior to 1990, waste management was carried out at adhoc basis; collection at certain interval and disposal.

- Thimphu Municipal Corporation started the first waste management establishing a small unit office and a landfill sometime in 1994.
- Only few dump trucks were deployed for waste collection.

Landfill was designed for capacity of 8-10 metric tonnes per day for a period of 7 years.

Solid Waste Management

 Now, with rapid urbanization and development, population has increased from 15000(1992) to 80000 (2005).

 The waste generation has increased from 8-10 metric tonnes to 36 metric tonnes a day.
 Presently, Thimphu Municipal Corporation has 6 compactor trucks, 2 tripper trucks, 2 dumper placers for collection and transportation to landfill.

Solid Waste Management

Landfill has now reached its optimum capacity. New Landfill has been identified 4 km ahead then the existing, but yet to be designed and operated. (lack funding and qualified manpower) A Compost Plant has also been placed which is also yet to be commissioned.

3R-concept & constraints

Reduce, Reuse and Recycle; 3R- is a new concept which Bhutan, keen to adopt as the landfill operation is a acute problem due to the geographical feature of the country. Switching to newer landfill cannot be continued further:

- Difficult in finding a suitable site.
- Water shed areas.
- Destroying the natural flora and fauna.
- Environmental disaster: soil & water

3R-Concept & Constraints



Presently, we are not able to collect 100% waste generated.

- Illegal dumping in the drains, roadside, open areas: no bylaws
- Civic sense & negligent littering.
- Awareness & education among Bhutanese society.

3R-Concept & Constraints

Segregation
Recycling
Composting(reuse)
Market for recyclable waste
A small scale recycling firm is set up but

very few collection from the public.

Constraints

- Privatizing the solid waste management:
 - No Government subsidy
 - No private firms
 interested
 - No by-laws
