

## Implementation of the 3Rs in South Africa

### **Policy and Legislative Framework for 3R Activities**

- Environment Conservation Act, 1989
- Policy on Integrated Waste and Pollution Management, 2000
- National Waste Management Strategy, 2000
- Waste Management Bill under development



- (1) Encouraging extended producer responsibility
- Government has signed voluntary agreements with the glass and tyre industries.
- Agreements are aimed at fostering extended producer responsibility.
- Through agreements, the respective industries made commitments to recover, reuse and recycle their products to agreed targets.

#### (2) Establishing a National Recycling Forum

- Government established a National Recycling Forum in order to coordinate recycling activities in the country at a national level.
- The Forum comprises representatives from government, the recycling industry and NGOs.
- The Forum provides direction and guidance to national recycling initiatives.



- (3) Promoting cleaner production
- Government has developed a national strategy for cleaner production.
- The strategy seeks to address the reduction of waste generation at source, as well encourage the efficient use of resources, especially natural resources, and the use of cleaner technologies.



- (4) Expanding industrial waste exchange
- Government has initiated a pilot programme to expand the reuse and recycling of industrial waste.
- The programme encourages the exchange of waste between industrial waste generators and waste recyclers.
- The programme is designed to serve as a model for reducing industrial waste that is currently being disposed to permitted waste disposal sites or dumped illegally.

- (5) Enhancing integrated waste management
- Government has transferred the permitting of waste disposal sites from the Ministry responsible for water resources to the Ministry responsible for the environment.
- The transfer further enhances the integrated management of waste and also supports the "cradle to grave" approach to waste management adopted by the government.
