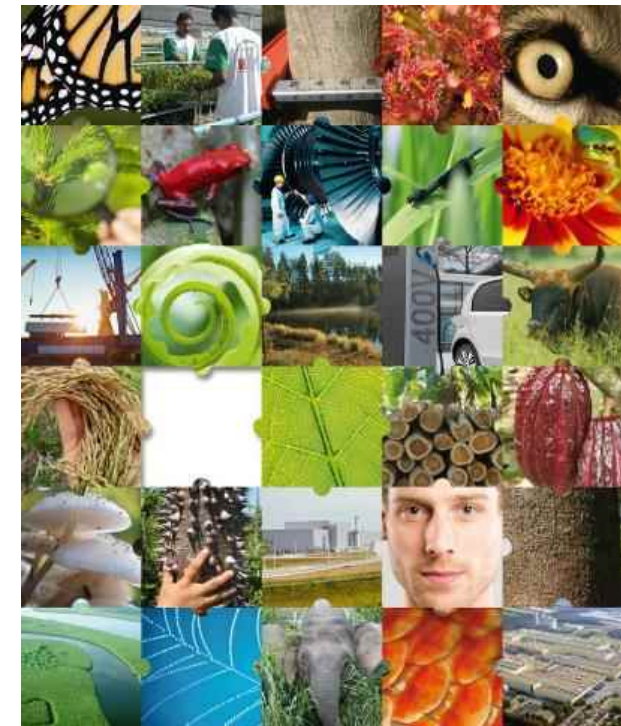

PIONEER STORY

‘BIODIVERSITY IN GOOD COMPANY’ – HOW IT ALL STARTED

- First business and biodiversity initiative in the private sector worldwide
- Launched at CBD-COP 9 (2008) in Bonn, Germany
- Initially funded by the German Ministry of the Environment
- 2011 successful transition into a not-for-profit association financed through membership fees

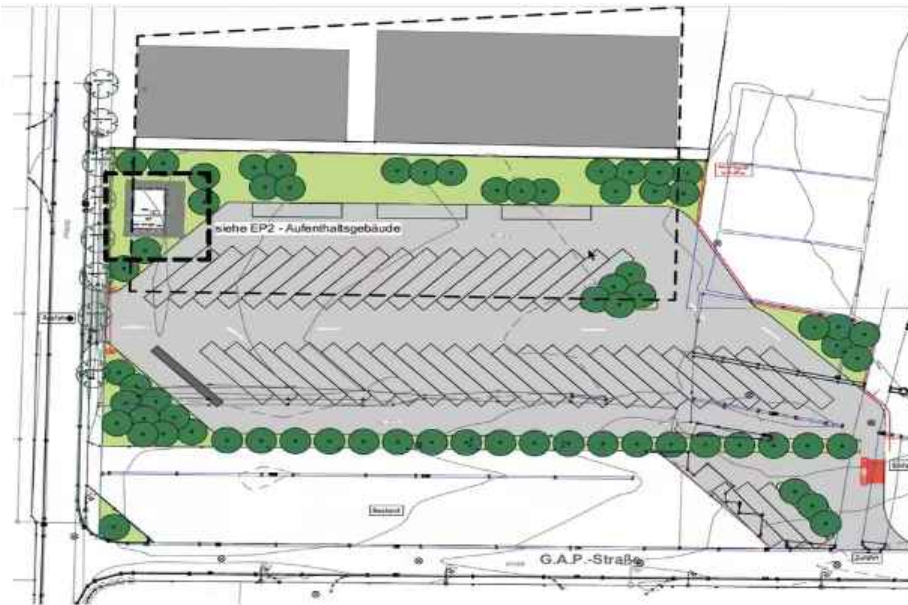

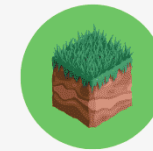

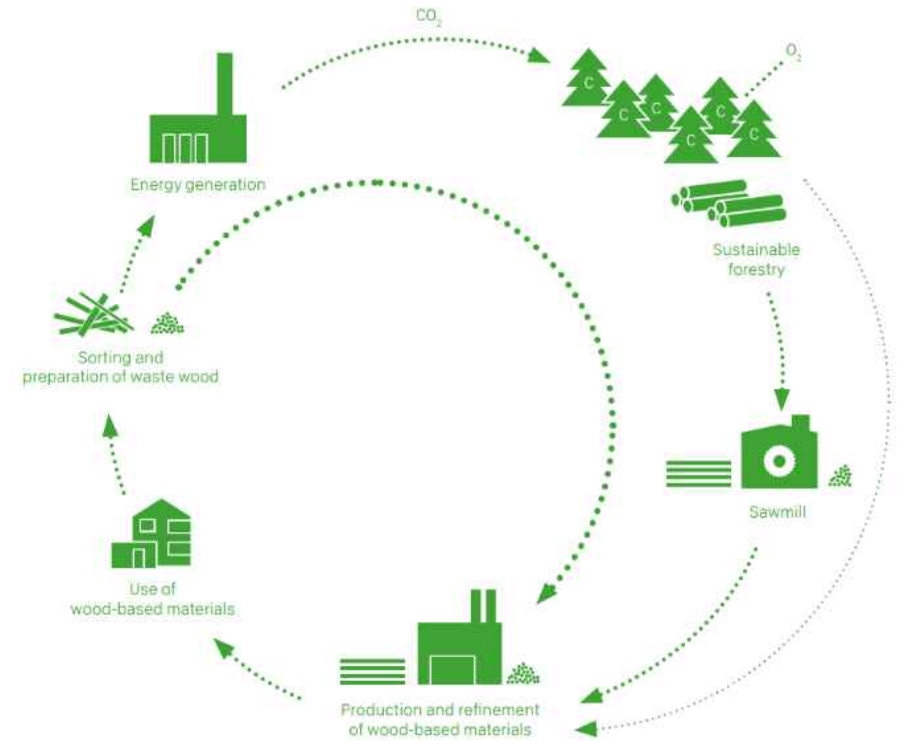

TARGETS, MEASURES, BUSINESS MODELS

- The UPM target of **net positive impact on biodiversity** was set in 2018 including forest management, forest conservation, and projects & collaboration
- At UPM, **corporate financing** and board incentives linked to long-term biodiversity and climate targets.
- In 2021 Pfleiderer set a target to foster **circular economy in the value chain** by increasing the share of post-consumer recycled wood and improving sorting systems
- In 2022 Pfleiderer set a target to assess sustainability in the **supply chain**, incl. biodiversity
- At Pfleiderer, corporate financing and **board incentives** linked to recycling and climate targets
- At Forest Finance, cocoa **product quality** is linked to forest management for biodiversity
