TARGETS, MEASURES, BUSINESS MODELS

- The UPM target of **net positive impact on biodiversity** was set in 2018 including forest management, forest conservation, and projects & collaboration
- At UPM, **corporate financing** and board incentives linked to long-term biodiversity and climate targets.
- In 2021 Pfleiderer set a target to foster circular economy in the value chain by increasing the share of post-consumer recycled wood and improving sorting systems
- In 2022 Pfleiderer set a target to asses sustainability in the **supply chain**, incl. biodiversity
- At Pfleiderer, corporate financing and **board incentives** linked to recycling and climate targets
- At Forest Finance, cocoa product quality is linked to forest management for biodiversity




