International Symposium on Environmental Endocrine Disrupters 2001 (1st Announcement)

Overview

This year's International Symposium on Environmental Endocrine Disrupters is scheduled to be held from Saturday, December 15 to Monday, December 17 at Tsukuba International Congress Center (Tsukuba, Ibaraki Prefecture).

The main theme shall be "Chemicals in the Century of the Environment," and the sub-theme shall be "Many-sided Approach to Endocrine Disrupters." The aim of the symposium is to find a solution to the problem of endocrine disrupting substances in the environment. The event is to be held in Tsukuba in connection with the completion of new facilities (Environmental Hormone Research Building) at the National Institute for Environmental Studies in March this year, which are dedicated to research of endocrine disrupters.
