# Target Learner Audience

The module is designed to give a first-hand visual introduction to mangrove reforestation as a CDM project.

The module is suitable for those who are in interested in promotion of sustainable development in the coastal zone of subtropics; those who are interested in resident participation in environmental protection activities; those who are interested in the formal procedures in CDM implementation under the Kyoto Protocol

The module is also of interest for those who are interested in community life in Fiji.

#### 4. Purpose of Training / Expected Outcomes:

The module traces the steps in defining a CDM project. CDM is a vital link between developed countries and the host countries in achieving financial as well as technology transfers in order to promote sustainable development. However, the formal procedure in qualifying as a CDM is generally regarded as cumbersome, resulting in less than optimal pace of the diffusion. This module fills the information gap taking a case from
