Dear Colleague,

We are now facing two global crises; the COVID-19 pandemic and climate change. Both crises have changed our perceptions of risk management and require the international community to step up cooperation manage large scale risks and cooperate in the implementation of wide-ranging measures.

As part of our coordinated efforts to overcome this difficult time together, the Japanese government will launch an Online Platform supported by the UNFCCC. In a virtual format, participating countries will be able to share their experiences and views on climate actions and environmental protection measures being considered or implemented, in the context of their response to and recovery from COVID-19.

The objectives of this Online Platform are as follows;

- Exchanging experiences and measures at a high level among countries to build a sustainable and resilient socio-economic system in the process of recovery from COVID-19, and
- Increasing the visibility of high-impact policy options to manage multiple risks and leave no one behind
- Maintaining momentum on international cooperation including through the UNFCCC regional climate weeks in 2021 and COP26.

**The ministerial meeting to unveil the Online Platform will be held through video conference, to cater for the different time zones of participants, at 20:00-23:00 in Tokyo time (13:00-16:00 CEST and 7:00-10:00 EST) on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2020.**
