
## City-to-City Collaboration between Kuala Lumpur City in Malaysia and Tokyo Metropolitan Government

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government and Kuala Lumpur City Hall are co-sponsors of the Asian Network of Major Cities 21, an international network of Asian cities, as well as members of the East, Southeast Asia & Oceania region (13 cities) of the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group. In 2020, they signed an agreement to collaborate on "sustainable energy management" and "decarbonization".

### **Kuala Lumpur City Hall - Malaysia**


At about the same time as Tokyo, the city declared its goal of achieving carbon neutrality by 2050, ahead of many other countries. The realization of the low-carbon urban district development concept is underway.





They announced their 2050 Zero Emissions Strategy ahead of other cities, and recently announced a goal of halving the amount of GHG emissions in Tokyo by 2030. Their extensive knowledge on how to improve energy efficiency in buildings is highly regarded worldwide. They were awarded by the World Green Building Council for the world's first urban cap-and-trade system.

#### ·Results:

- During the project period, KL City announced its zero emission strategy for the year 2050.
- A renovation plan for KL's four public buildings was developed and the city secured its own budget.
- As a result of support for the energy survey, estimating the reduction potential, selecting the buildings for retrofit, and formulating guidelines of around 2,000 public buildings owned by KL City, the planning and budgeting capabilities of KL City officials for low-carbon buildings were improved.
- A local company began to collaborate with KL City in the low-carbon district.
