


Partnership to Strengthen Transparency for co-Innovation

PaSTI - the Partnership to Strengthen Transparency for co-Innovation -

The PaSTI supports developing countries to strengthen transparency action with promoting the engagement of non-state actors, based on utilization of low-carbon technologies and know-how in a collaborative and co-innovative manner ("co-innovation").

WHAT - Goal of PaSTI



The PaSTI aims to deliver three key outputs.

- 1) Promoting the engagement of non-state actors such as private companies and local governments with incentive mechanism
- 2) Enhancing the capacities and institutional structure in each country under their national development strategies
- Strengthening and streamlining the transparency action at subnational, national and regional level

WHY – Background of PaSTI

Under the Paris Agreement, it is indispensable to enhance transparency of reporting climate change actions to ensure mutual trust and understandings among countries. In particular, engagement of non-state actors is essential for reporting system, innovative climate actions, and risk reduction. The PaSTI, established in 2017 by the Ministry of the Environment Japan (MOEJ) in collaboration with World Resources Institute (WRI), encourages non-state actors to contribute to low carbon society with promoting the linkage among stakeholders.







HOW - Actions of PaSTI

The PaSTI aims to add value to the existing initiatives on transparency. Based on this idea, it improves Monitoring, Reporting, and Verification (MRV) system with relevant tools and capacity enhancement. It also promotes incentive mechanisms to facilitate non-state actors' engagement in expectation that it leads to business opportunity and to deployment of innovative technologies and practices.




"Sure" PaST
