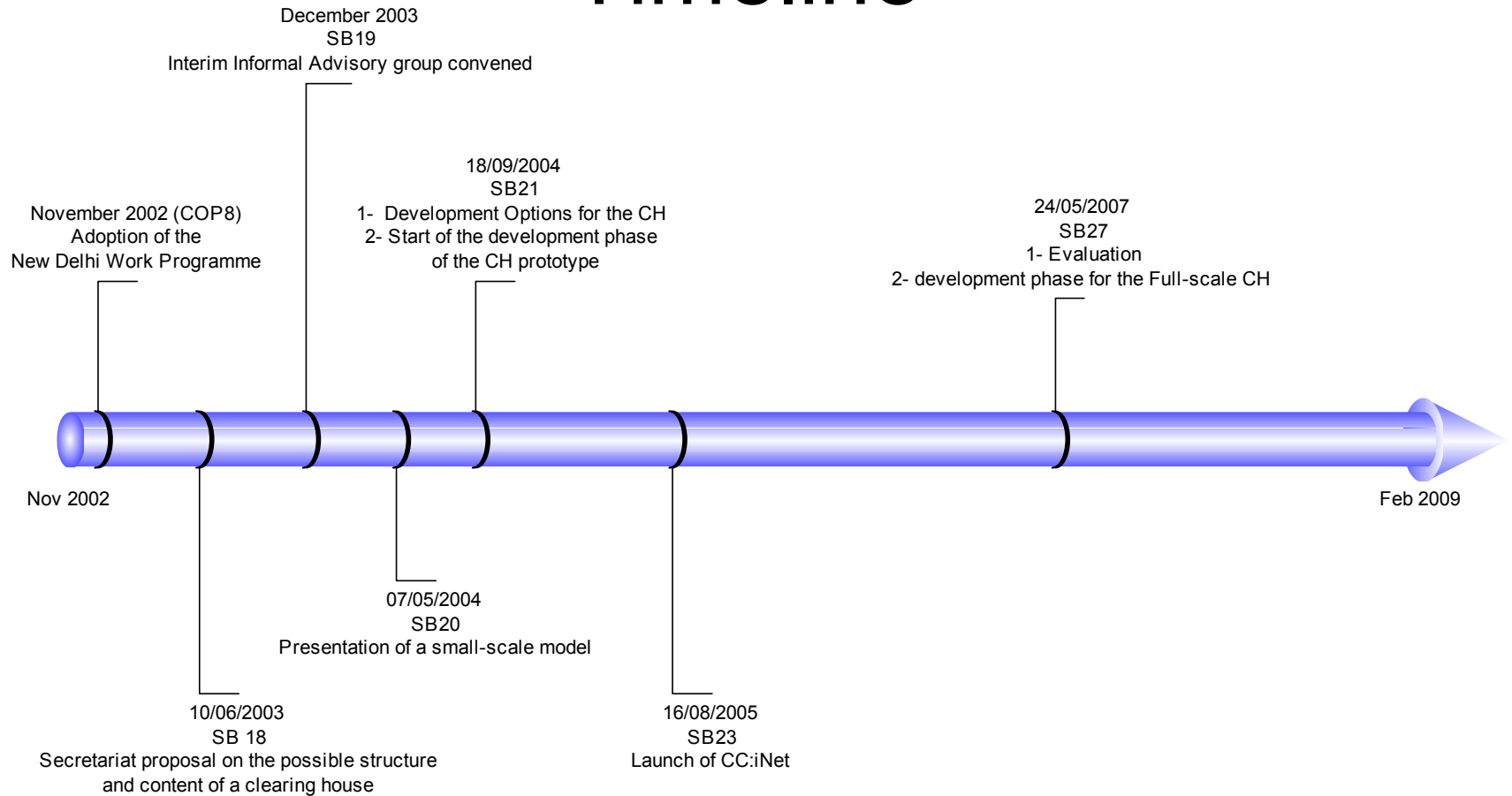


Purpose & objective

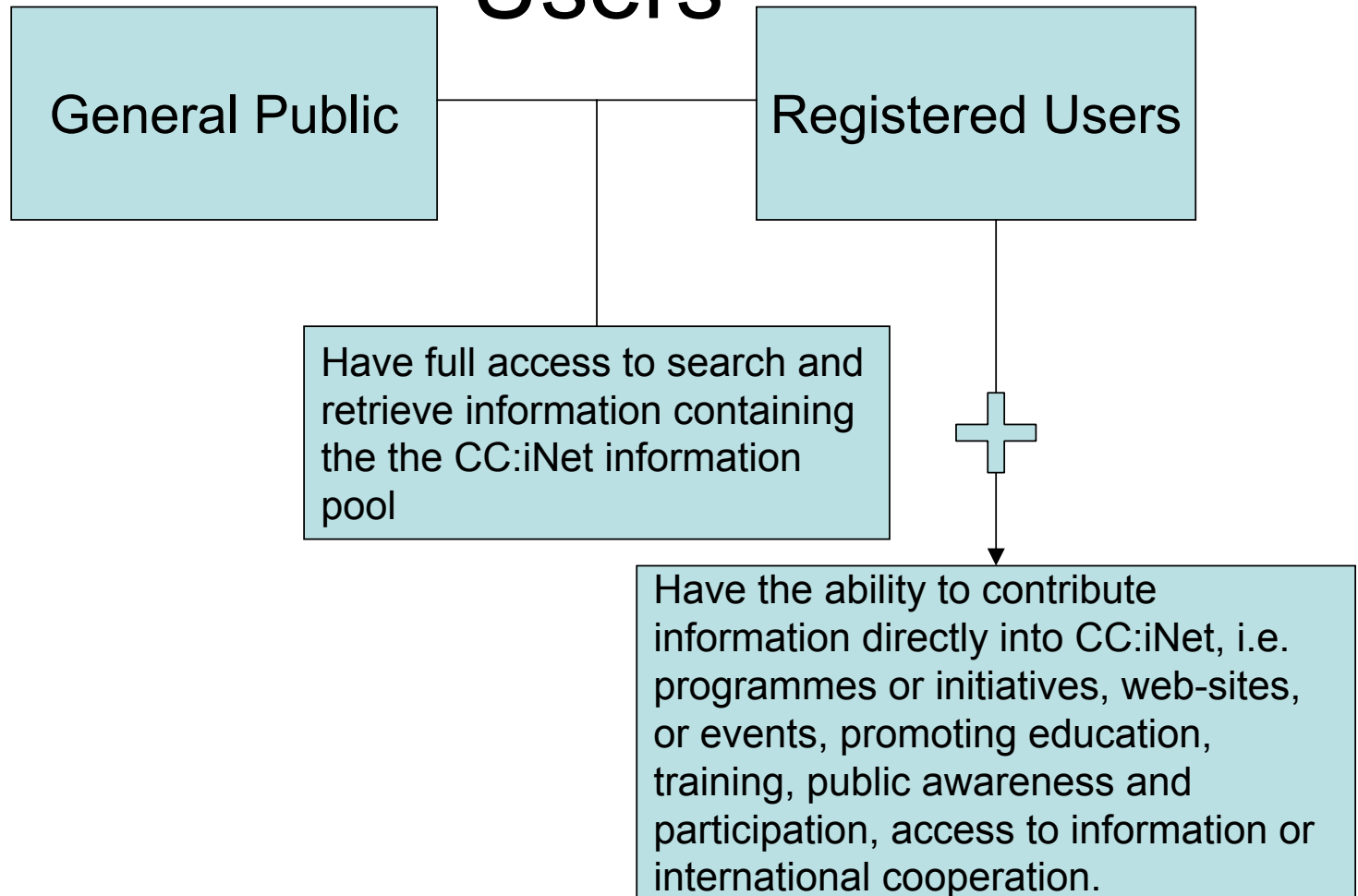

Two key strategies available to enhance the ability of host countries to utilize the CDM are information collection/rearrangement/dissemination and capacity building. In most host countries some relevant information already exists, but often in disparate pieces or not considered in terms of the CDM—and it has never been put together before in a comprehensive form. This is the main reason for publishing this series of guidebooks, which feature information on specific countries in Asia. By making the guidebooks as user-friendly as possible, they provide essential information that project developers and investors will need for most effective CDM project preparation and implementation in each country. This guidebook is part of a series prepared as a core component of the information dissemination and awareness-raising activities under the Japanese Ministry of the Environment's Integrated Capacity Strengthening for Clean Development Mechanism/Joint Implementation (ICS-CDM/JI) programme.

Positive feedback

- Contained in document FCCC/SBI/2006/MISC.15
- “A good platform for Parties, especially for developing Parties to have access to have information on climate change” – China
- CC:iNet gives users the possibility for the advanced and qualitative access to the information sources on the problem of climate change .



Examples of areas for improvement

- Additional level of navigation to allow for more intuitive usage and faster access to targeted information
- Additional content on bi- and multilateral assistance programmes providing support for the development and implementation of education, training and public awareness activities
- An alternative version that would allow countries with limited and/or irregular internet services, access to the information – *e.g. downloadable version that updates when connected*



Opportunities for Regional Nodes

- Facilitate targeting of information to a given region (storage as well as subsequent retrieval and use)
- Provide neutral/reliable platform for regions where needed
- Make CC:iNET a major hub for Article 6, applicable at all levels: national, regional and global level



Possible Approaches

- Shared databases for parent site and nodes (distributed network)
- Shared common list of keywords used in database construction, databases independent (scheduled synchronization a possibility)
- Fully interactive clearing house using “Wiki” approach – fully transparent knowledge construction
- Extend concept to education – fully interactive development of curricula, and other learning materials



Indicators & Statistics

- Total Hits on CC:iNet content stands at over 200k
- Based on the last 60 days, the average Hits measured at about 800 hits per day
- Average of 3 new registered users per month since launch
