The Mongolian government's response to address the issue of climate change has been positive


- Ratification of the UNFCCC (1993)
- Ratification of the Kyoto Protocol (1999)

Undertaken steps to implement UNFCCC's goal

- Initial national communication (1st November 2001)
- Submission of list of NAMAs (28th January 2010)
- Second national communication (10th December 2010)
- National Action Program on Climate Change (6th January 2011)
- Technology Needs Assessment (2013)


Ongoing projects to fulfill UNFCCC's reporting obligation






INDC: MITIGATION

THE SECTION COULD BE CONSIST OF:

- CC trend, impacts & vulnerability (forest, water resources, animal husbandry8 arable farming, soil, pastureland, natural disaster, human settlement & tourism)
- Need of long term adaptation strategy, objectives, projections
- Current and short term adaptation measures and activities
- Technologies and methodologies to implement adaptation measures and activities
- Constraints, needs & gaps to implement adaptation measures and activities
- Review of financial and technical support
- Methodology for monitoring & evaluation

CHALLENGES:



- Limited timeframe
- Technical and human capacity
- Coordination and communication with key ministries / agencies to engage actively on INDC development
- Understanding the importance of INDC
