Background

- Southeast Asia region is known as the world's largest area of mangrove, extending over 6.8 million Ha, representing 34-42% of the world's total (in 1980s)
- The largest areas of mangrove in SE Asia are found in Indonesia (4.2 million hectare, or almost 60% of SE Asia's total).
- By 1990s mangrove forests are disappearing due to unsustainable utilization and habitat conversion until 15%.
- Several solutions to these problems have been adopted in member countries, such as restoration and rehabilitation.
- Establishing a united network for sharing the commendable practices and lessons learned.
- ASOF 14th and 15th to form ASEAN Mangrove Network

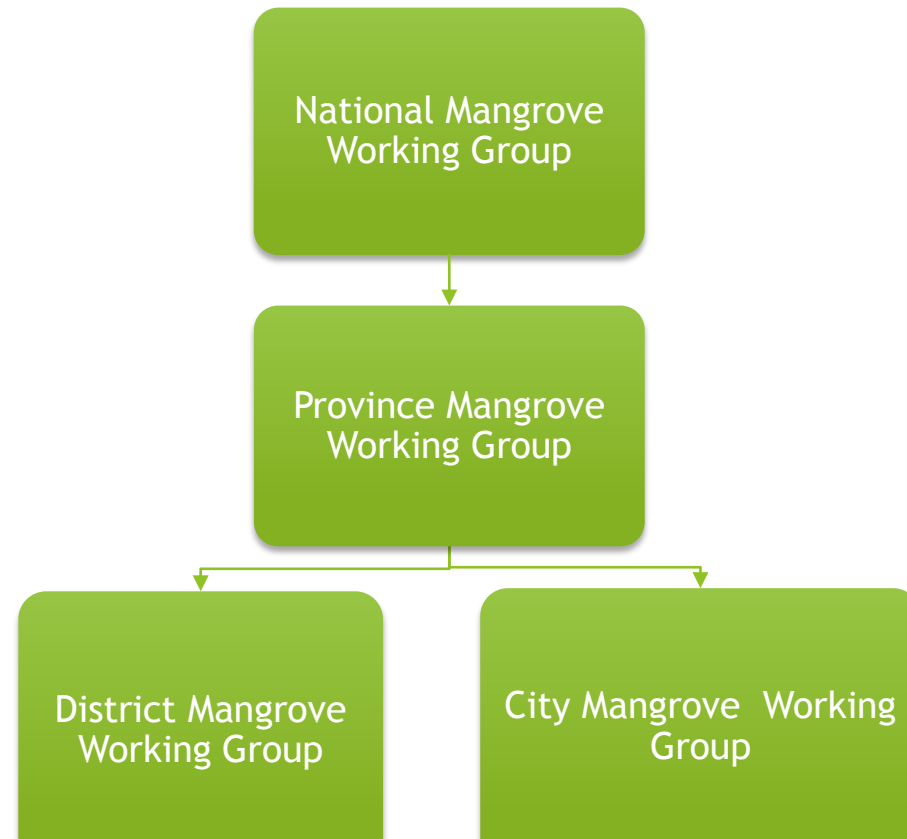
AMNET - The Task

AMNET - Indonesian approach

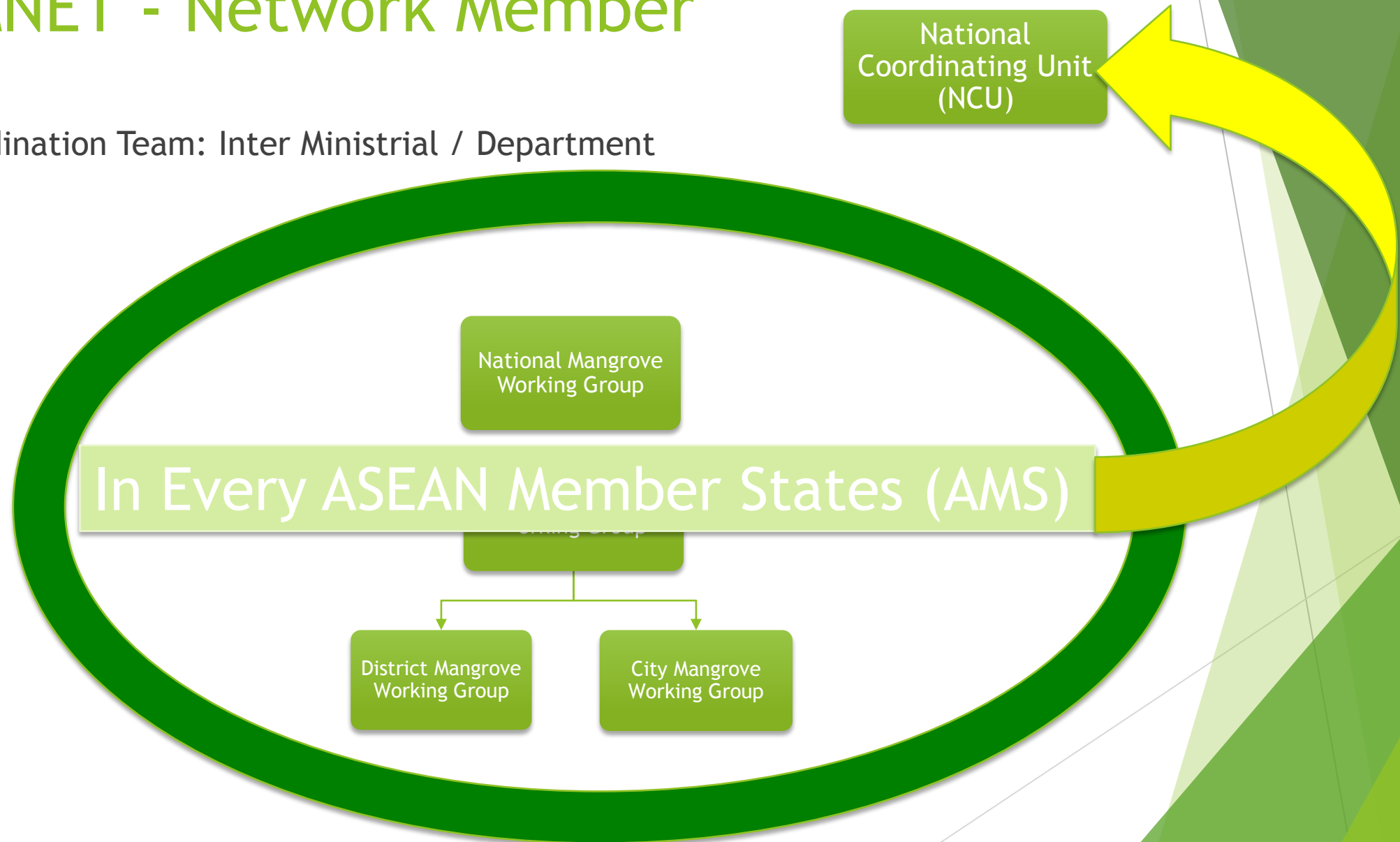

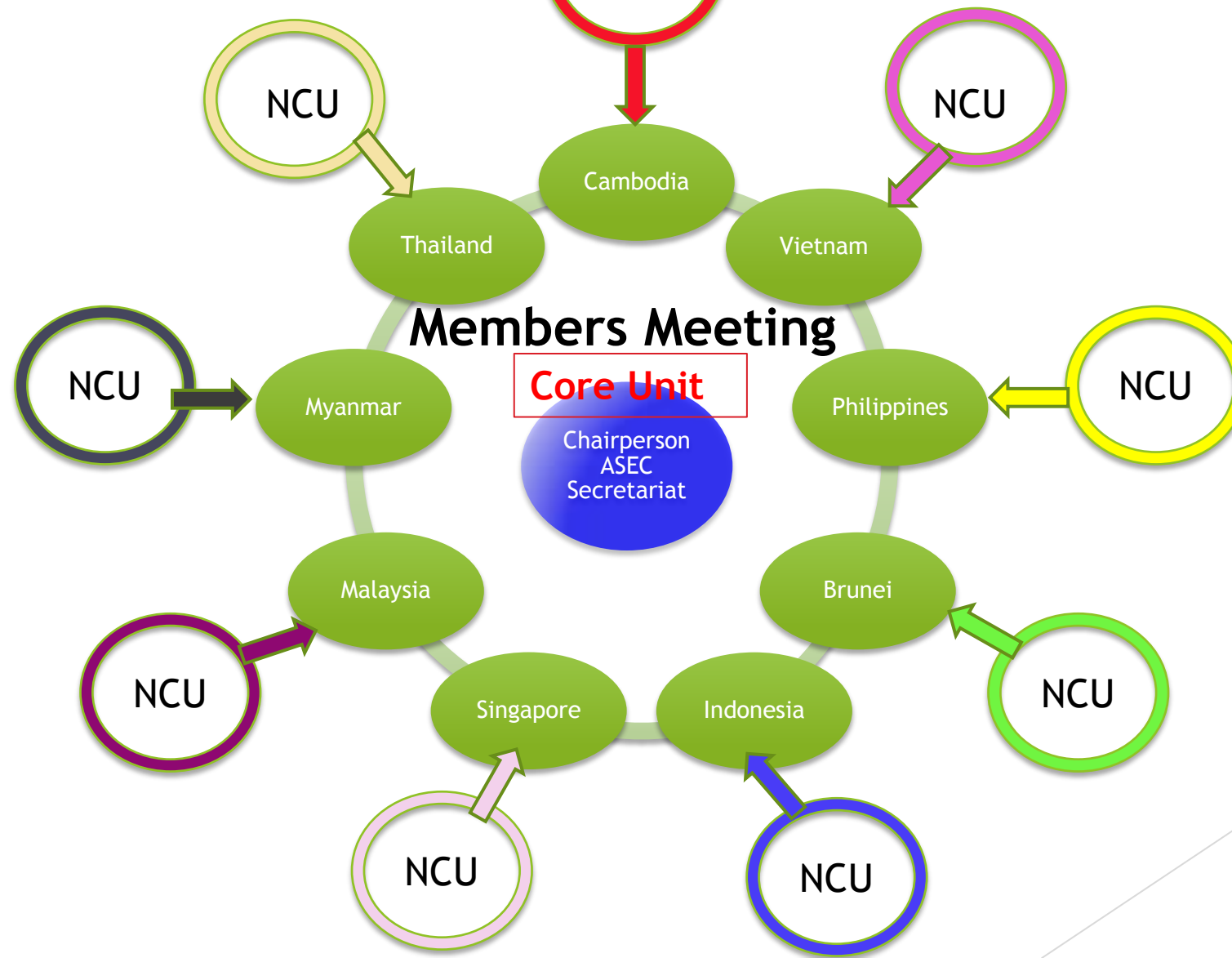

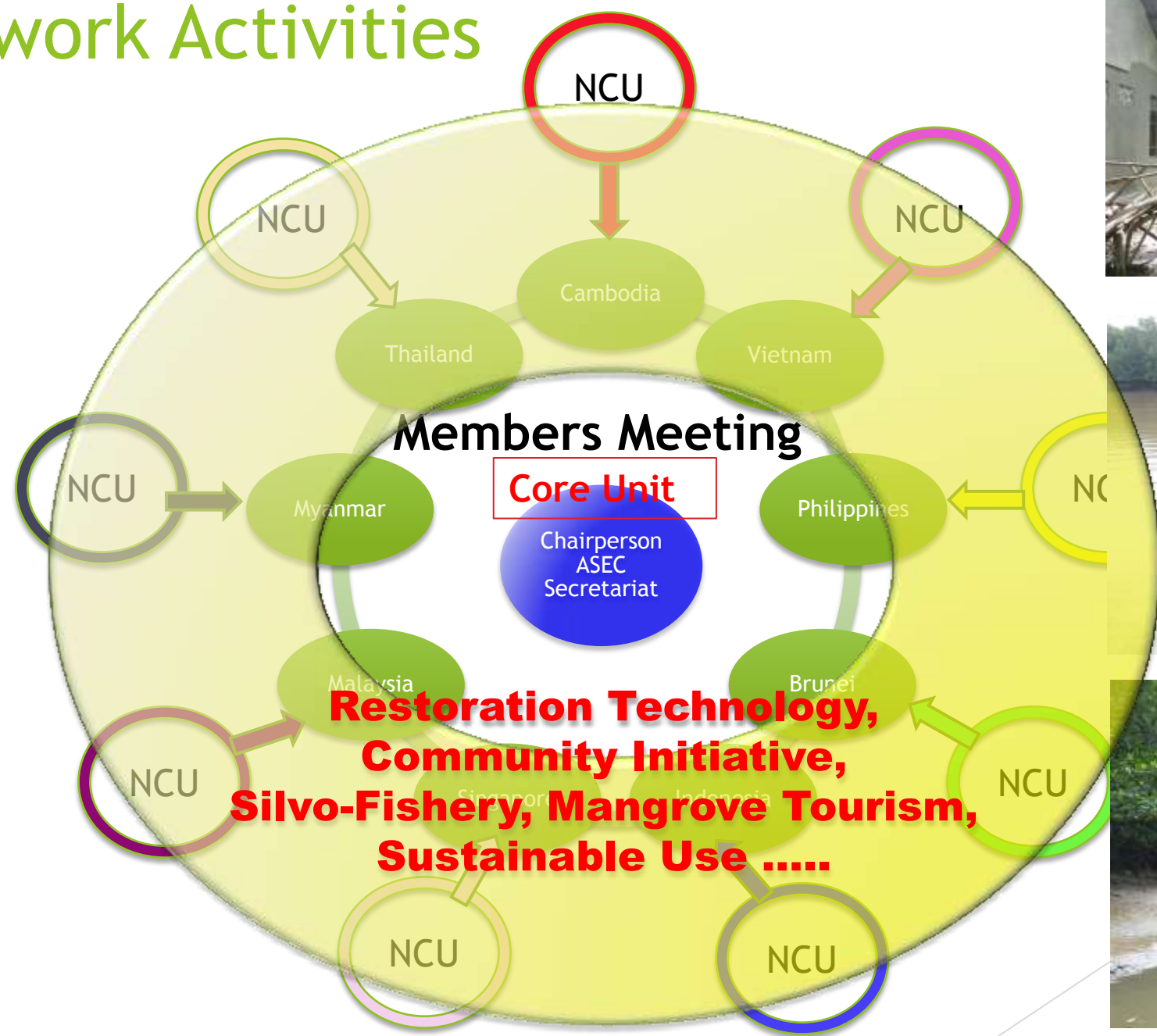

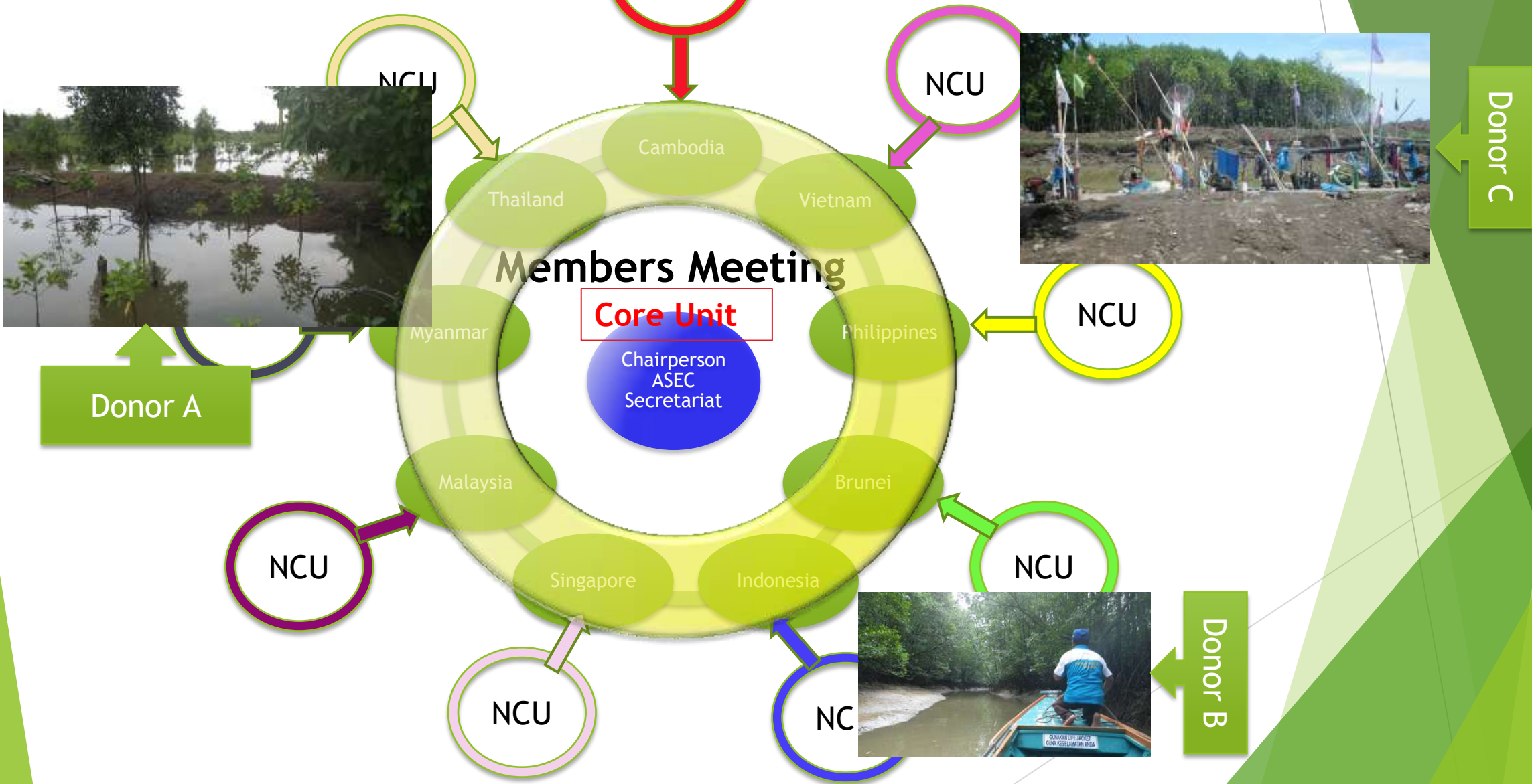
Network Functional Structure



Network Activities



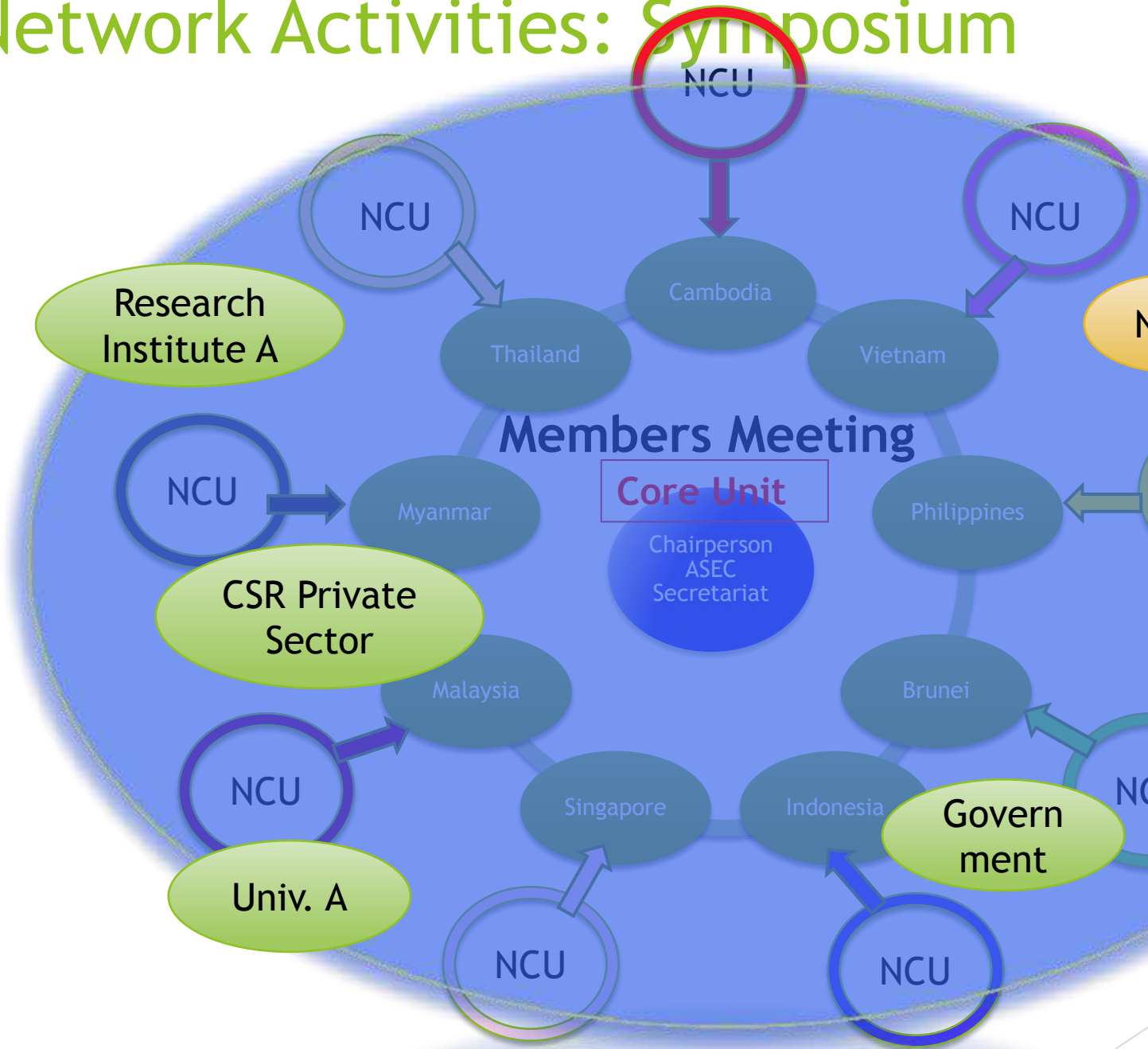
