


Background Information


- Built on the success of MEA-REN, Regional Enforcement Network for Chemicals and Waste

Review of AN-REN joint workshops in 2012

The 1st AN-REN joint workshop (on 21 November 2012, Cebu, the Philippines) was organized to enhance collaborations among two networks.

Review of AN-REN Joint Workshop 2012

Session1: Collaboration among Regional Networks

- Exchanged activities conducted in each enforcement network and exchange view on possible collaboration among networks.
- Discussed role of key players facilitating collaborations (e.g., BCRCs, academia, etc.)
- Considered possible way to coordinate network activities (e.g., creation of common website, etc.)

Session 2: Tackling Illegal Trafficking through Effective Enforcement Responses

- Discussed the approach for tackling illegal trafficking.
- Learned the importance on actively involving judges and prosecutors is critical for effective enforcement.

Session3: Technical Assistance on Implementing Take-Back

- Exchanged specific experiences of take-back and discussed difficulties on implementing take-back.
- Discussed possible inter-regional collaboration between Asia and EU for addressing take-back issues.
