

# Welcome to Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden

The present site of Shinjuku Gyoen was originally one part of Edo residence of the Lord Naito, the vassal of Ieyasu Tokugawa. In the Meiji era, it became an agricultural experiment station, and then in 1906 it was made into an imperial garden. After the war in 1949, it was opened to the public as a national garden. The garden contains three styles, Landscape Garden, Formal Garden, and Japanese Traditional Garden, and is considered to be one of the most important modern western style gardens in the Meiji era.

### Autumn Roses at Formal Garden

About 100 different species of 500 roses are in full bloom at rose beds of Formal Garden twice a year, in the spring and autumn. The autumn roses have deeper petal colors and better and stronger fragrance. The autumn bright yellow and gold colors of sycamore trees are also worth seeing.

Free rental wheelchairs are available at all entrances and at the Service Center.

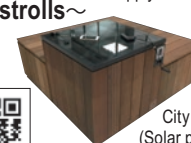

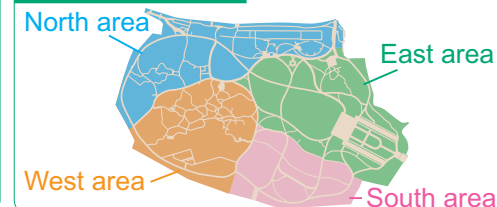


Bottle Filling Station
