

 - (English) The Twelfth Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD COP-12)



- Meeting venue : (Alpensia Convention Center, PyeongChang, Gangwon Province, Republic of Korea)
- Approximately 20,000 people are expected to participate



Strategy 4. The CBD COP12 that encourages participation of the general public


Domestic and International Cooperative Network

- Contribute to technical and scientific cooperation (The Korea Biodiversity Initiative)






Venue : PyeongChang, Korea






The whole view of Alpensia Conference Center
