# **Preparedness for your family**

## Have a plan...

- How family members can contact each other. Where to meet up.
- Where to store your emergency supplies. Checking their contents.
- Pet evacuation.
- Disaster response when you are away from home.

# Gather community information, and participate in evacuation drills.

- Check the disaster plans for your area.
  - → Are pets allowed in the evacuation shelters?
- Take part in evacuation drills in your area with your pet.

# Preparedness for your pet

- Make sure to stockpile supplies that you will need when you evacuate during an emergency.
- Pet owners are responsible for providing for their pets.
- Prioritize which supplies to take first, and store them in one location.

## PRIORITY 1

#### Items that are critical to life and health

- ☐ Drinking water (at least 5 days' worth)
- ☐ Pet food (at least 5 days' worth)
- ☐ Prescription and therapeutic food
- ☐ Prescription and other medication
- ☐ Extra collar, harness, and leash (fixed length, not retractable)
- ☐ Food bowl
- ☐ Cloth packing tape (for repairing cages and various other uses)

#### PRIORITY 2

#### Pet and owner information

- ☐ Pet owner contact numbers, photo taken with your pet
- ☐ Photos of your pet (front, rear, right, and left views)
- ☐ Vaccination information
- ☐ Existing medical conditions, current health
- ☐ Regular veterinarian, etc.

# PRIORITY 3

### **Pet supplies**

- ☐ Pet sheets, cat litter (the kind your pet is used to)
- ☐ Items for handling excrement
- ☐ Litter box tray
- ☐ Towels, brush
- ☐ Laundry net (for cats)
- ☐ Your pet's favorite toys, etc.
