

Yonehara Beach is designated as the Iriomote Ishigaki National Park. In order to conserve the natural environment and promote its sustainable use, please cooperate with the following rules.

Preparatory council to consider the rules for Yonehara Beach

The number of accidents involving children is increasing. Please be sure to accompany your children and keep an eye on them.

Do not enter the sea if you feel unwell or have consumed alcohol.



Wear a life jacket or wet suit when swimming and protect yourself with a rash guard.

(Prepare for unforeseen accidents and prevent contact with dangerous marine organisms.)



It is extremely dangerous to swim in stormy weather (when a warning has been issued and/or when a typhoon is approaching or passing)!



Do not damage corals.

(Coral damage is regulated by the Natural Parks Act. Do not step on and/or break the corals.)



Do not catch wild marine organisms.

(The harvesting of corals, tropical fish, giant clams, etc., is regulated by the Natural Parks Act and the Okinawa Prefecture Fisheries Adjustment Regulations.)



Use environmentally friendly sunscreens.



Do not use harpoons or underwater guns.

(Underwater guns are prohibited by the Okinawa Prefecture Fisheries Adjustment Regulations.)



Do not build bonfires or set off fireworks on the beach.
