- Develop multi-layered network of stakeholders Govt, academia, scientific and research community, private sector, NGOs, for promotion of 3R;
- Proliferation for National 3R Strategies
- •Facilitate interagency coordination for achieving greater synergies in various capacity building efforts in 3R areas;
- •Facilitate establishment of a Subsidiary Expert Group that would provide strategic feedback and technical input to the policy consultations/discussions at the Forum and Thematic Workshops (e.g, needbased workshops in e-waste, EPR, technology assessment, etc.);
- •Drive better implementation of 3R in a more harmonized manner across Asia
